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## TSSSA RUGBY LEAGUE - WILLIE TALAU CUP, SENIOR GIRLS 9<sup>5</sup> (TERI TAMATI TROPHY), & JUNIOR RUGBY LEAGUE

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DATE: Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> September

VENUE: Waitara Rugby League Club – Clifton Park

TIMES:

- Approximately Event finishes **3pm**

Mouthguards and boots must be worn at all times whilst on the field. These will be checked by referees before the start of each game.

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## WILLIE TALAU CUP RULES & DETAILS

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- Games are played in 15 minute halves (30 minute games) with unlimited interchange. A maximum of 17 players may take the field in any one game. You may bring more than 17 to the tournament, however only 17 may play in each match.
- The games will have a straight swap at half-time, with 2 minutes allocated for the changeover.
- The clock is run by TSSSA and NOT the individual referees. Time will not stop during play. The hooter will determine the start & finish of each half.
- Subs are required to sit in the designated sub zone.
- Team coach and/or manager will be required to fill out the team list prior to each game.
- International Rugby League rules apply for in-game officiating.

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## SENIOR GIRLS 9<sup>5</sup> RULES & DETAILS

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DESCRIPTION: Rugby League Event for Senior Girls

- Games are played in 9 minute halves with unlimited interchange (18 minute games).
- Games are 9 aside and a maximum of 13 players may take the field in any one game. You may bring more than 13 to the tournament, however only 13 may play in each match.
- Subs are required to sit in the designated sub zone.
- Team coach and/or manager will be required to fill out the team list prior to each game.
- Girls may enter as an INDIVIDUAL and on the day will be put in a team. This is if the school doesn't have enough students to make up a full team.

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## JUNIOR RUGBY LEAGUE DETAILS

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**DESCRIPTION:** This is a Junior 9-a-Side Rugby League tournament for years 9 & 10 students. Both categories are dependent on entries. Teams may bring a **MAXIMUM** of 15 players in their squad with a **MAXIMUM** of 13 taking part in any one game (9 active players, 4 subs).

### RULES

- Games are played in 9 minute halves with unlimited interchange (18 minute games).
- Games are 9 aside and a maximum of 13 players may take the field in any one game. You may bring more than 13 to the tournament, however only 13 may play in each match.
- Team coach and/or manager will be required to fill out the team list prior to each game.
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**CATEGORIES:** Junior Girls; Junior Boys

**GIRLS:** Girls may enter as an **INDIVIDUAL** and on the day will be put in a team. This is if the school doesn't have enough students to make up a full team.

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## HEALTH & SAFETY

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TSSSA always have a first aid kit present at events & TSSSA staff are first aid trained.

All SMS forms are sent to sports coordinators/TIC and are uploaded to the TSSSA website at least two weeks prior to the event.

Health & Safety is a shared responsibility; therefore, it is important that at TSSSA events:

- School representatives are present, supervising their students at the event from start to finish. Ultimately the students are the responsibility of the school, and in the event of an emergency, it will be the responsibility of the school representative to head count their own students.
- School representatives carry a list of participants who are present at the event & also a record of any participant medical conditions.
- Students come prepared in suitable clothing & with sufficient food & water for the activity's duration.
